Star Throwers is a cancer support charity in Norfolk dedicated to supporting people with cancer and their carers, from diagnosis through to life after cancer.

The Star Throwers Centre was opened in 2009 and has supported over 2,500 people affected by cancer, with:



Cancer Information and Help with Understanding Treatment Options



Complementary Therapies, Nutrition Advice, Counselling and Group Workshops



Lymphoedema Prevention, Treatment and Support

We support people with many types of cancer by providing evidence-based information about their diagnosis and treatment options.

Our wellbeing service aims to help patients and carers cope with the effects of their cancer and cancer treatments.

All of the support Star Throwers offers is completely free of charge, thanks to our amazing donors and supporters.

Using our cancer specialism to enable cancer patients to become better informed about their diagnosis and treatment options and improve the well-being of them and their carers.

Our Progress

Over the past 18 months Star Throwers has experienced significant change, we have been working towards:

1. Developing a sustainable organisation, by:

- Recruiting a new Board of Trustees, who have refreshed and reviewed the Mission, Vision and strategic direction of the charity.
- Rebranding and refreshing the charity logo and image to appeal to a wider audience.
- Launching a new website with clear information about out services, fundraising opportunities and events.
- Investing in new IT software and equipment to safeguard our service user and supporter information.
- Reviewing our current structure, policies & procedures & making improvements to meet the needs of the charity.
- Developing fundraising initiatives and events to stabilise fluctuations in monthly income.
- Establishing regular volunteer 'thank you' events and feedback opportunities to ensure our volunteers feel more valued
- Developing our relationships with supporters, local community and corporates.

2. Continuing and maximising our services, by:

- Employing an additional Nurse to increase the capacity of our information service.
- Advertising for additional Complementary Therapists to meet the needs of our service users.
- Securing funding to train additional Therapists to support our lymphoedema service.
- Investigating ways to maintain and improve our buildings and contents and a redecoration/ refresh of the centre.
- Measuring feedback from our service users.

3. Reaching out to new service users and supporters, by:

- Increasing our range of support services, including: Forrest Yoga, Zhineng Qigong and Nutritional one-to-one sessions.
- Linking up with new support groups, including: Flat Friends and Mesothelioma Support Group.
- Increasing awareness of our services through local press, fundraising, awareness events, corporate partnerships and advertising.
- Growing relationships with local GP surgeries, hospital and NHS contacts such as the Lymphoedema Clinic at Bowthorpe.

Our Demand

One in two people will be diagnosed with some form of cancer in their lifetime and whilst the survival rates have doubled in the past 40 years the anxiety and worry linked to a cancer diagnosis can be long lasting for all involved.



Cancer Information and Help with Understanding Treatment Options

The Need:

- 27% of cancer patients do not completely understand the explanation given of their cancer.
- Only 27% of cancer patients feel they had their treatment options completely explained to them.
- 23% feel they were not involved as much as they wanted to be in decisions about their care and treatment. *

We Offer:

Cancer information sessions with our Nurse to support people to take control of their cancer journey. We can help patients become well informed about their cancer diagnosis and treatment options.



Complementary Therapies, Nutrition Advice, Counselling and Group Workshops

The Need:

Around **40%** of people in the UK seek out complementary therapies or integrative therapies after receiving a cancer diagnosis.

We Offer:

A range of free complementary and supportive services to cancer patients and their carers throughout a cancer diagnosis and beyond.



Lymphoedema Prevention, Management and Support

The Need:

Lymphoedema is diagnosed in approximately 10-20% of cancer patients. It is a non-curable condition but can be managed with early diagnosis and ongoing support and therapy.

We Offer:

Information, support and management therapies for people who have been diagnosed with or who have cancer-related lymphoedema.

Our Impact

In 2019 we provided 1,590 individual and group support session to 264 cancer patients and carers. This number does not include the number of people who visit our centre for an informal chat and hot cuppa, often enjoyed by our roaring open fire in the Winter or in the beautiful gardens in the Summer months.

We are able to deliver this level of individual support due to the dedication of our small staff team and support of our wonderful volunteers, who donate thousands of hours of their time to supporting our centre, therapies, shops and fundraising events.



In 2019 we held 420 cancer information sessions for those affected by cancer.



Our Nurse held 60 appointments for cancer-related Lymphoedema.



Our therapists gave 951 free complementary therapy treatments to cancer patients and their carers.

We provided 20 nutrition talks and 43 one-to-one nutrition information sessions for those affected by cancer.

We held 96 group therapies and workshops for cancer patients and their carers.

Our Volunteers

Star Throwers owes its success largely to the ongoing support of our amazing volunteers. Our volunteers donate over 5,000 hours of their time every year to support our centre, therapies, shops, events, fundraising and governance.

Our centre volunteers provide administrative and emotional support to ensure that the Star Throwers Centre remains a positive and supportive 'haven' for cancer patients and their carers.





Summary of Expenditure - Year ending May 2019



Summary of Charitable Expenditure



Our 2020 Priorities

Star Throwers has achieved much as a cancer support charity over the past ten years, but we recognise now is the time to concentrate on the sustainability of the charity in order to grow our support services further. We have developed some key objectives to help us achieve this vision and have set specific actions for 2020.







1. We will strengthen our current processes and improve the sustainability of the charity.

2020 Actions:

- » Consider the current risks of the charity by creating a Risk Register and Asset Register and propose ongoing review.
- » Stabilise the fluctuations in monthly income by increasing Star Throwers own fundraising/events, corporate support and collection tins.
- » Improve value for money commitments and scope savings by budgeting effectively and reviewing contractual commitments.
- » Review and update our statutory compliance policies to safeguard the charity, service users, supporters, staff and volunteers.
- » Staff and volunteer structure to be reviewed and strengthened with continual self-appraisal initiated.
- » Ensure all volunteers feel valued and supported through improved induction, training, feedback process and recognition.
- » Invest in technology to support the charity's operations and service delivery.

2. We will maximise and increase the capacity of our current services and staff and volunteer skills.

2020 Actions:

- » Increase the capacity of our cancer information service by employing an additional Cancer Information Nurse.
- » Maximise the capacity of our complementary therapies by recruiting more therapists.
- » Expand our lymphoedema service by training additional therapist(s) to deliver information and support.
- » Maintain and improve our buildings and equipment to provide the best possible experience for our service users.
- » Improve our processes for measuring impact by implementing online, offline and face-to-face feedback options.





3. We will raise greater awareness of our services to users and supporters.

2020 Actions:

- » Increase our support services to appeal to a wider demographic by researching the 'need' for men's support groups.
- » Scope the provision for 'Family Therapy' available to support the families and children of those affected by cancer.
- » Establish an annual awareness/ fundraising day accessible for all to take part in.
- » Increase our geographical awareness in Attleborough through local press, businesses and contacts.
- » Increase our presence and awareness in local GP surgeries and hospital contacts.
- » Draw up proposals for 'outreach' services in the community.
